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Now What? Take One Step Forward At A Time!

perintendents were discussing their fall activities in preparation for winter and snow mold control. Other issues, such as putting green topdressing, late season aeration, drainage, tree maintenance and equipment maintenance were discussed in detail. However, one of the biggest concerns focused on



dealing with another summer like 2010.

There are still many agronomic programs that need to be completed before winter is here, and it is never too early to communicate with golfers and committees about course setup for the New Year. Defining the course setup allows for a more accurate determination of the necessary programs to achieve course playability criteria. The Green and/or Golf Committees define the course setup, and the maintenance staff are charged with meeting golfer expectations. Without a defined setup document, it is very difficult to meet expectations. In effect, it is like trying to hit a moving target. Now is the time to come together, put on a pot of coffee, and decide how the course should play and, ultimately, be maintained. Only then can an accurate and realistic budget be outlined.

This past season, there was much discussion about developing fast and firm conditioning. Contrary to many golfers' beliefs, fast and firm playing conditions are not achieved by

GCSAA UPDATE

The GCSAA Board of Directors, 2011 board candidates, and 87 delegates representing 93 of GCSAA's 100 affiliated chapters, convened at the Hilton Kansas City Airport on October 23-24, for the 18th annual Chapter Delegates Meeting. GCSAA Financial Position

Interim Chief Executive Officer Rhett Evans discussed GCSAA's financial position stating that overall the GCSAA is in financial good health; however the current economy and a down golf market have taken its toll. Due to prudent past and present leaders GCSAA has a financial reserve of \$6.5 million, has no long-term debt, owns the headquarters building and has a high membership retention rate. All of which add to a solid financial picture.

GCSAA Dues Increase Proposal

Proposed GCSAA member dues are established though a process that was created by the delegates that uses the Consumer Price Index (CPI) as a guide. The members then vote upon the proposal at the association's annual meeting in February. The process calls for the association to consider a dues adjustment every two years as a means of ensuring a sustainable organization. The process is not automatic, and the GCSAA Board of Directors may elect not to bring forward dues adjustments according to schedule as was the case last year when the board opted to forgo consideration of an increase. The board supports a dues increase for 2011 because it represents your opportunity to help ensure the success of your career and your facility.

The main points on why there is a need for a dues increase are:

- It will allow the association to begin covering costs that have already risen in the years since the last increase. They have experienced a 5.8 percent rate of inflation since that time and therefore need the increase to compensate for that. Dues would be increased by \$20 for Classes A and SM, and by \$10 for Class C.
- GCSAA dues account for 27 percent of the GCSAA budget, which is less than that of comparable associations (38-40 percent).
- The two-year cycle was approved in order to keep increases smaller and more frequent thus eliminating the need for large, 20 percent increases that had a significant negative impact on membership growth and retention, which was the main reason the CPI-based process was requested and developed.
- Though not tied to a specific program, project or service, GCSAA member dues support the entirety of association programs and services that members have deemed valuable to them and their facilities.
- GCSAA has also looked to reduce expenses and create more efficient operations. Over the last three years GCSAA has cut \$5.4 million from its budget and has reduced its staff by more than 25 percent. This has been necessitated by a decrease in revenues of roughly the same amount (\$5 million) during that same period. Because membership has decreased over the years, the actual revenues generated through member dues have decreased.
- GCSAA is diligently exploring additional revenue opportunities, those that are somewhat traditional and others that have not been pursued before.
- The board is committed to no longer funding traditional operating expense items from the association's reserve account.

Having heard these arguments in person, and considering that it amounts to 5 cents/day, I recommend that the CPGCSA should support the increase however we will vote at the annual meeting based on what we hear from the CPGCSA members.

Field Staff Expansion

The program began in 2006 as a pilot program to create a tie between chapters and the GCSAA so the chapters can better utilize and benefit from GCSAA programs and services, for GCSAA to learn more about chapters and their needs and ultimately to grow membership for both. There is no offering of agronomic services as that is well supplied through the USGA and private consultants. The feedback from chapters who have utilized the program has been overwhelmingly positive and those chapters have continually expressed interest and support.

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The board of directors announced in August the expansion of the program and shared that affiliated chapters have been grouped into nine regions. The goal is to eventually have resident field staff in each region. Four regions will have field staff trained and fully in place by mid-2011.

These regions were selected in this first expansion phase using "as-needed" criteria that included specific requests for regional support, a desire to balance field staff throughout the nation and available resources. Regions not immediately receiving resident field staff will continue to have access to GCSAA resources. As for the remaining regions, the board voted at their Fall Board Meeting to fill two additional field staff regions sometime in the last quarter of 2011, which will bring the total to six field staff. They took this action in recognition of the value of this program and the desire to get the entire program fully functional as soon as possible. The board has yet to determine which regions these two positions will focus on. A timeline for filling the final three regions will be based on available resources.

GCSAA CEO Search

It was somewhat disappointing, but understandable, that Mark Woodward's resignation was not explained any further (due to employer/employee confidentiality), however James R. Fitzroy, CGCS, GCSAA President updated the delegates on the search for a new chief executive officer for the GCSAA. The board of directors has hired an executive search firm to assist with the search process and is clear on what they are looking for in a candidate and as a result the position description has been posted on the GCSAA website. They have targeted early January 2011 for initial candidate interviews with the follow-up interviews in the following weeks. President Fitzroy assured the delegates that GCSAA is not on "hold" during this transition period.

Additional Information

- Six chapters made presentation on programs they have instituted with the assistance of GCSAA resources in the areas of
 government relations, corporate partnerships, consolidation/sharing of resources and communications.
- New program initiatives in the area of web services, environmental programs, marketing communications, surveys and data and media public relations were shared.
- Considerable advancements were noted in the area of professional development resources with the new job board, self assessment tool and webcasting software.
- Outlined were new features for Conference and Show including education programs, networking opportunities and costsaving options available to attendees.
- Candidate presentations for the offices of president, vice president and secretary/treasurer and a minimum of two and potentially three directors.

simply turning off the irrigation. There must be a holistic plan put forth to develop this playing condition, and once the plan is in hand, it may need to be implemented over a number of years to achieve the desired playing quality. The Mid-Atlantic regional conferences scheduled for Richmond, Virginia on March 8th and Baltimore, Maryland on March 15th will offer presentations on the issue.

As we move into the next phase in the change of season, put forth every effort to do at least one or two things that will make your course operation better. For example, it is not too early to give us a call to schedule a Turf Advisory Service visit for next season. Open discussion with course officials can be very productive. Golfers' concerns can be addressed, programs can be discussed, and realistic expectations and goals can be put forth.
