

Wee One Foundation

The Wee One Foundation was founded in 2004 when friends of Wayne Otto, CGCS banned together to financially assist him in his battle with cancer. Wayne was a pioneer in the turf industry always searching for new and better ways to produce a finer playing surface. As Wayne learned more about his disease, he applied those same pioneering principles to overcome his illness.

Those that knew Wayne, knew a man small in stature and a

man that placed more effort and enthusiasm into his friendships and care for his fellow man. As passionate as Wayne was about turf, his love for life could not measure. Wayne died in the fall of 2004 but his passion for life and his willingness to

help still live on because of the work of the Wee One Founda-

Through the perseverance and hard work of several friends of Wayne, the group developed its mission of helping those in need. Founded on the principle of assisting golf course management professionals (or their dependents) who incur overwhelming expenses due to medical hardship without comprehensive insurance or adequate financial resources, the Foundation has evolved into a cause that goes way beyond its initial reason for existence.

The Wee One Foundation was aptly named to honor Wayne. Nicknames are rarely chosen by their owner as in this case. On a golfing trip to Scotland with some friends, one of the group's caddies decided to place his wager on the "wee one". A small action (as legend has it) that turned out to be a sound decision by the caddie that day and a small gesture that has helped many other individuals through economic hardships due to overwhelming medical expenses. Simply, that is what the Wee One Foundation accomplishes today.

Since its inception in 2004 the Wee One Foundation has gifted over \$1,000,000 to those in need. The Foundation raises money through its membership, golf outings and sponsorships.

Which, to me, seem more bothersome than a dry spot here or there. This season has proven to me that the "brown is the new green" movement is going to be a tough sell to our customers.

And it doesn't stop there. Friends, relatives, and anyone else I know that is aware of my occupation always has the same thing to say. It goes something like this: "Wow, this must've been a good year for you." Does that sound familiar?

The first few times that I've heard that comment, I was admittedly miffed that my profession was being simplified to the point where excessive rainfall made my job easier. But when you dig a little deeper into that innocent little comment there is an underlying perception that may be much harder to overcome. That perception is that properly maintaining a golf course requires a shipload of water, and not only that, but the more the better.

The fact is that golfer expectations, along with public and administrative perceptions have to change in a big way before the real movement toward water conservation takes place. I, like most Superintendents are "all in" when it comes to conserving water. I'm sold. The problem lies in the fact that clogged drains, tire ruts and bunker washouts are more invisible to golfers than a brown spot on the edge of a fairway.

Our meeting this month is our PSU Football bus trip. It is always a fun time, and with all of this rain, I expect everyone to be able to take the day off and go!
